On the 9th of November, many months of hard work was showcased when Piopio Primary and Āria School kapa haka groups came together in the Piopio College gym for the Mokau Ki Runga performance.

The tamariki were all dressed in their Mokau Ki Runga shirts with the logo that had been given to them a number of years ago. It is a mirror image representing both kura, including all our Maunga and Pae Maunga within Piopio and Āria. In 2014, a combined schools kapa haka group was formed and they were given the



name 'Mōkau Ki Runga' meaning Mōkau to the South, which is a reference point within the Tainui compass and it is a tribal marker/ boundary.

Whānau gathered ready to hear some stunning waiata, watch some great poi action and be moved by the strong haka.



No one was disappointed, the tamariki performed with pride and confidence. They were led by senior students, Kadius Young from Āria School and Aria Bourke from Piopio Primary.

The group performed a number of waiata, including the girls using poi. It was lovely to see all the poi moving at the same time and the confidence that the poi were used with. To conclude the performance the boys performed a strong haka, which the audience enjoyed immensely.

toes 2023!

I love growing and distributing tomato plants each year to encourage everyone to learn to grow their own. As with most things, people find there's no comparison between what you can grow vs buy.

This year I encountered two additional challenges. I'd decided to grow zucchini, pumpkins and butternut squash plants to share as well, and those took over the glasshouse as they grew and grew. It was a jungle. Reference was made to a novel and movie called "The Day of the Triffids," of which I was unaware, where plants take over the world. I had to move them on to make room for potting all the tomato seedlings. If I do them again, I'll pot them up after the tomatoes.

My second challenge was pots. I know I've been banging on about the need to return those pots to the stand for reuse, but if I don't get them back, we can't do what we do. By my count we distributed over 800 seedling tomatoes this year. I recently read that the Heritage Food Crops Trust gave away 1400 tomato plants one day this season; indeed, the bar has been raised. I will need pots. And by now, everyone knows that they're the square ones (not six packs) that are usually grey, black,

WELL, we got through Heirloom Toma- blue or red, and the taller square ones that are orange, red, or blue. Not picky, are we?

> It's looking to be a good season for both the veggie garden and the orchard. After having no plums last year at all, our trees are dripping green fruit. We are already enjoying zucchini and have some green tomatoes, pumpkins and butternut are flowering. I've planted the seed potatoes and am about to tackle the kumara.

> Due to the weather damage in Hawkes Bay and resulting shortage of tinned fruit you might want to take a stab at bottling some fruit this year, especially if people are sharing lots of surplus.

> I've found Golden Queen peaches and pears to be the easiest and can share some tips when we get to that point in

> While I'd made jams and fruit paste, I hadn't really bottled fruit until about a year ago. Now we use it all winter.

Please don't hesitate to contact me with any questions/issues. Contributions of surplus to the stand would be welcome and appreciated. Updates are posted pretty much daily on our FB page. We'll decorate the stand for the Christmas parade and come up with some goodies


The Piopio Cosmopolitan carpark is to get a much needed upgrade. The new carpark will be an asset to the district.

Piopio Retirement Village update and invite

Most of you are probably aware that Piopio has a Retirement Village complex at 5 Kaka Street. At present there are 10 units soon to be 11.

The Piopio Retirement Trust owns the land and seven units (5 one-bedroom and 2 two-bedroom), and there are three units which are owned by the occupiers. A fourth unit is soon to be built and owned by the occupier. All units are currently full.

The land was originally donated by the Boddie family and what you see today is a result of a huge amount of volunteer work and machinery provided by many local people over a long period of time and up to the present.

The tenants in the units owned by the Trust pay a weekly rental, and the owner occupied units pay a right to occupy fee, as they own the building but not the land.

The complex is administered by a group of trustees who do a magnificent job. I am president (have been for quite a few years), Jenny Brodie is treasurer, and had been secretary/treasurer for an extremely long period

of time, before Liz Morgan took over the secretary's position.

Other present trustees are Ross Smith who is vice president, Debbie McFarlane (property), Wendy Weinberg, Phil Brodie, Ken Perry, Stuart Darke, Andrew Downey, Chris Young (property), and Mona Bidois.

The complex is run on a volunteer basis mainly by the trustees and, broadly speaking, the only paid services are for lawn mowing, and services e.g. plumber, builder, electrician, accountant etc.


We are fortunate to have tenants who take great pride in the appearance of the village and willingly help with gardening and other maintenance jobs, ably led by Chris and Des Young.



My name is Hillary Morgan.

This year I have specialised in learning difficulties (SLD) through SPELD.

Speld is an organisation that, for 50 years, has advocated, tutored, and assessed children and adults with specific learning difficulties (Dyslexia, Dyscalculia and Dysgraphia). Speld receives no funding from the government.

I am focused on our little community and helping those families that need to boost their child's confidence with their schoolwork. Just because we are a rural community does not mean that our children should miss out on extra support,

so I decided to do something about it.

If you are concerned about your child's reading, spelling, writing or maths, then get in touch. They don't need to be Dyslexic to get some extra help and confidence with their reading and maths. My teaching is about working to their strengths with one-on-one support and teaching strategies to support their learning.

If assessment for a formal diagnosis is needed for an SLD I can also help with organising that. Subsidies are also available for assessment and tutoring if your family meets the requirements.

have had pride of place for a number of years along the front fence have disappeared. They have been taken down because many are broken and rotted.



pay for the additional paint and brushes needed. Then the design phase started.




