Room 5 Scientific Learning

Growing a Bean Seed in a Bag

In week one Room 5 planted a bean seed in a bag as part of their science work. The learning intention was for tamariki to be able to discuss how plants grow from seed, understand they have specific needs to grow, and explore the germination process. As a class we would visit Room 8, where the bean seeds are growing, every 2-3 days to check on their progress. Before we went to Room 8 we would write a prediction relating to what we might see when we went to observe our beans. Each time we were super excited by the changes we observed. Tamariki would record the observations in the science workbooks and draw a picture to support their observations. To complete the task, each tamariki published a presentation on the life cycle of a plant, with a diagram, reflecting their work since week one.





ROOM 5 The Arts - Visual Arts - Monster Silhouettes

Room 5 have been working on creating a Monster Silhouette for Visual Art. The learning intention was for tamariki to be able to follow step by step instructions to make a stencil, cut it out, and keep all the pieces joined before gluing it to their pastel background. This work linked our Mathematics geometry work as we were also considering symmetry and reflection in our pastel backgrounds. We created a draft monster first before we worked on our good copy using black paper. Tamariki learnt the importance of keeping their design simple, which helped them when it came to cutting out the outline and the inner details, such as eyes, and noses. The final step was to create a pastel background using hot/warm colours on one half of the page and cold/cool colours on the other side of the page. Once these were complete tamariki glued their silhouettes onto the background and then they were laminated. Tamariki were really proud of what they had achieved and their finished work looks amazing! 
